

ROBERT PLANT

& THE STRANGE SENSATION LIVE DVD PACKED WITH EXTRAS RELEASED JANUARY 29TH ON UNIVERSAL

'Robert Plant & The Strange Sensation', released on January 29th on Universal, is Robert Plant's first ever solo DVD.

Taped in late 2005 for the Soundstage TV programme in an hourplus concert, Robert Plant and his fine Strange Sensation band split the set roughly 50/50 between Led Zeppelin tunes and tracks from the recent 'Might Rearranger', his most fully realised solo album to date.

Jettisoning the Zeppelin-era poses – both visual and vocal – he lays aside the histrionics and allows the music's dynamics to provide the thrills in this hour plus show.

Led Zeppelin classics such as 'Whole Lotta Love', 'No Quarter' and 'Black Dog' are interspersed with new songs such as 'Tin Pan Valley' and 'The Enchanter'.

Bonus tracks include a cover of 'Hey Joe', which pays tribute to Hendrix not by mimicking his version but by channelling his experimentalism, adding North African musical elements to the mix.

Extras include the promotional videos for 'Morning Due' and '29 Palms' as well as Top Of The Pops performances of 'Big Log' and '29 Palms', plus a jukebox facility.

Running time is 81 minutes approx.
